

An Act to amend the Interim Constitution and other Electoral Laws to reduce from twenty-one to eighteen years the age of persons qualified to vote at elections

[11TH JULY, 1969]

ENACTED by the Parliament of the United Republic of Tanzania.


1. This Act may be cited as the Elections (Age of Voting) Act, 1969. Short title
2. Section 4 of the Interim Constitution of Tanzania, 1965 is amended Section 4 of the Constitution amended in subsection (1) by deleting the words "the age of twenty-one years" and substituting therefor the words "the age of eighteen years".
3. Section 8 of the National Assembly (Elections) Act, 1964 is Section 8 of Cap. 551 amended amended by deleting the words "the age of twenty-one years" and substituting therefor the words "the age of eighteen years".
4. Any provision in any written law which provides that a person shall be qualified to vote at, or register as a voter for, an election for President, a member of the National Assembly or a member of a local authority on attaining the age of twenty-one years shall be read as if there were substituted for such age the age of eighteen years. General amendment of written laws
