

An Act to amend the Immunities and Privileges (Extension and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance

[7TH MAY, 1971]

ENACTED by the Parliament of the United Republic of Tanzania.

1. This Act may be cited as the Immunities and Privileges (Extension and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance (Amendment) Act, 1971, and shall be read as one with the Immunities and Privileges (Extension and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance and shall be deemed to have come into operation on first day of April, 1971.

2. In this Act "Ordinance" means the Immunities and Privileges (Extension and Miscellaneous Provisions) Ordinance.

"Special provisions relating to customs duty

E.A.H.C. Acts, 1962 No. 12

13. If any goods which have been imported or taken out of bond without payment of customs duty by a person in pursuance of any diplomatic immunity or privilege, or other immunity or privilege conferred or granted by or under this Ordinance, are disposed of by way of sale, gift, barter or otherwise, to any person who does not enjoy customs franchise privileges, the person to whom such goods are so disposed of shall be liable to pay the duty thereon and the provisions of section 103 of the East African Customs and Transfer Tax Management Act, 1952, shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to such goods and to such person as if references under subsection (2) of the said section to the person
